We have a wonderful line up of speakers, including John Forsyth, University at Albany, SUNY and Rob Horner, University of Oregon. In addition to our regular conference program, four workshops will be presented. BCBA credit and NCPA Category A credit for psychologists are available for workshop attendance and 10 additional BCBA credits can be obtained by attending approved sessions in the regular program. A poster session, silent auction, book fair and NCABA social will round out the conference events. Conference Workshops

Pre-Conference Workshop I - Presenter: John Forsyth, Ph.D. "Acceptance and Commitment Therapy for Anxiety Disorders: A Nuts and Bolts Workshop". This workshop presents a unified Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT) protocol for persons suffering from any of the major anxiety disorders. ACT is a newer third generation behavior therapy based on behavior analytic research and theory (i.e., Relational Frame Theory) regarding the nature of human language and cognition. This work, in turn, conceptualizes most psychological suffering as resulting from unnecessary and unworkable verbal self-regulatory processes (i.e., excessive rule-governed behavior, fusion with literal language, experimental avoidance) getting in the way of value-guided actions. Experiential exercises (acceptance, mindfulness, defusion) and value-guided behavioral activation that are central to ACT for Anxiety Disorders will be emphasized throughout the workshop. Some techniques will be demonstrated, and participants will have the opportunity to try them out too. Clinical worksheets and other tools will be provided.

Pre-Conference Workshop II – Presenter: Jeannie Golden, Ph.D. "New Behavioral Challenges: Assessment and Treatment of Emotional Difficulties in Children". The assessment of the emotional level of development of children in essential in providing effective treatment. Emotional level of development determines appropriate skills to teach and aids in the selection of appropriate reinforcers. Stages of emotional development and skills to emotional factors precipitating and maintaining target behaviors. Appropriate replacement behaviors will be identified. Specific case examples will be discussed of typically developing children who experience emotional difficulties who are experiencing emotional difficulties. Participants will have an opportunity to discuss specific cases from their own professional settings and receive input and suggestions from the presenters.

Post-Conference Workshop I -Presenter: Duke Schell, Ph.D. "Ethical Issues in the Assessment and Treatment of Behavioral Disorders" This workshop will focus on legal issues related to the assessment and treatment of severe behavioral disorders and the management of treatment plans that address them. Ethical issues will be discusses across several treatment settings including homes, schools, mental retardation and mental health facilities, and community MR/MH settings.

Post-Conference Workshop II - Presenter: Martin Ivancic, Ph.D. "Programming for Life Quality and Staff Pride". Behavioral programming will be described to offer life quality services to any person unable to provide such services to him or herself. Programming will include all written documents and forms necessary to conduct the program with an emphasis on clinical notes and resolving conditions related to poor life quality reports. Manual or PDA documentation options will be reviewed. Management procedures to promote pride in conducting Life Quality or any other programming will be reviewed with an emphasis on producing staff behavior that occurs outside the presence of the relevant manager.


