The NCABA 25th annual conference will include presentations by many professionals from within North Carolina and from across the country. We have a wonderful lineup of invited address speakers, including A. Charles Catania (University of Maryland, Baltimore County), Dennis Reid (Carolina Behavior Analysis and Support Center), Jeannie Golden (East Carolina University), Jim Bodfish (Vanderbilt University), Carol Pilgrim (University of North Carolina at Wilmington), Tiffany Hodges (OptumHealth), Julie Grimes (Animalworks, LLC & Davidson County Community College), Cynthia Anderson (Appalachian State University), Marsha B. Conference Workshops

Pre-Conference Workshop I - Presenter: Jeannie Golden, Ph.D., BCBA-D, Professor, & Rhys Potts, Kay Exum, Denise Griswold, Jenna Hilgoe, Cary Trump, & Carolina Hines, Graduate Students, East Carolina University "Establishing a Modified PBIS Approach in a Rural Intermediate School." Presenters will describe the development and implementation of a modified version of Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports in an intermediate school located in an impoverished, rural geographic area. Components of the process have included: gaining administrative support, establishing a culture of consistency, developing school-wide expectations and procedures, gathering functional assessment and progress monitoring data, creating a positive environment with social and tangible reinforcement, classroom management strategies based on function, teacher buy-in and training, behavioral consultation for children with challenging behaviors, and empowering the school to be more independent while fading ourselves. Presenters will discuss challenges specific to an impoverished, rural geographic area and provide strategies for overcoming those challenges. Teacher friendly forms and checklists will also be provided.

Conference Workshops (Continued)

Pre-Conference Workshop II - *Presenter: Cynthia Anderson, Ph.D., BCBA-D,* "Conducting Functional Behavior Assessments with Typically Developing Students: Efficient and Effective Assessment." Functional behavior assessment (FBA) is an evidence-based method for identifying the reason(s) an individual engages in problem behavior and for developing an effective intervention. Methods of FBA range from relatively efficient indirect methods to rigorous experimental methods. Of existing methods, some are more appropriate for use in schools, with typically developing students than others. In this workshop, efficient and effective methods of FBA for high-incidence populations will be introduced. Attendees will have the opportunity to practice using different methods of FBA via role-plays and vignettes and will learn to identify an appropriate method of FBA for a given context and presenting problem.

Pre-Conference Workshop III - *Presenter: Tamara S. Kasper, M.S., CCC-SLP, BCBA,* "A Behavior Analyst's Approach to Teaching Communication Skills." This workshop is designed to meet the unique communication and social needs of children with autism and other developmental disabilities who possess intermediate level language skills but appear to lack the motivation and foundational skills needed for social interaction with peers. Building on current treatment methods from the field of speech-language pathology as viewed through the eyes of a behavior analyst and research from the afield of behavior analysis, this seminar draws from multiple treatment frameworks. Gain insight and learn specific methods to enhance advanced language skills, and build social interaction and conversational skills in the context of a five-level social skills curriculum from peer play to community based social experiences. Learn systematic, research-proven methods with video illustration to effectively identify missing component skills and transfer skills from therapy to community.

Post-Conference Workshop IV - *Presenter: A. Charles Catania, Ph.D.*, "Everything You Wanted to Know About Verbal Behavior But Were Afraid to Ask." We will review the basic verbal classes (e.g., echoic behavior, manding, tacting, intraverbals, autoclitics) both as introduced by Skinner, especially in his book *Verbal Behavior*, and as they have since evolved. We will see how these classes are related to such basic behavioral phenomena as reinforcement and stimulus control. This background allows us to examine current research on verbal processes that enter into varied human settings and that are fundamental to varied applications. The topics we will consider include: the distinction between verbal units (e.g., phonemes, alphabets) and physical units; naming and other higher order classes; abstraction; the role of verbal behavior in judging one's own behavior; multiple causation in verbal behavior; the shaping of verbal behavior; correspondences between saying and doing; verbal governance (as in following instructions); and the implications of these topics for treatment and for educational and other settings.

Post-Conference Workshop V - *Presenter: Cynthia Anderson, Ph.D., BCBA-D,* "Function-Based Support: Developing Effective Interventions Based on Results of a Functional Behavior Assessment." Functional behavior assessment (FBA) is an evidence-based method for identifying the reason(s) an individual engages in problem behavior and for developing an effective intervention. Whilst conducting an FBA takes some skill, developing interventions based on an FBA requires even more knowledge and expertise. A function-based intervention must take into account (1) environmental variables that evoke and maintain problem behavior, (2) existing skill deficits that affect student behavior, (3) the teacher's capacity to implement an individualized intervention, and (4) contextual factors that may facilitate or inhibit implementation of the intervention. Workshop attendees will learn strategies for linking results of the FBA to an efficient and effective intervention. Efficient methods for monitoring student progress and implementation fidelity will be provided as well. Attendees will have the opportunity to practice developing comprehensive interventions using case vignettes from school settings.
